Soup kitchen serving 7 days a week

Hofwyl-Broadfield Plantation – State Historic Site

Rice plantation 1807-1915, becoming a dairy farm in 1942
Volunteer opportunities available Tuesdays through Saturdays
Trail clearing and maintenance; assist with maintaining 7 historic structures
Groups of 12 or more will need to supply equipment depending on project

Morningstar Youth Estate Center

Residential facility for boys and girls ages 7 – 18.
These youth are developmentally delayed with severe emotional and/or behavioral disorders.
Saturday volunteer projects may be available. Small to medium groups preferred.
Beautification project with emphasis on planting and yard work. Planting a Pumpkin Patch in July. Painting, construction projects for skilled workers, adopt a highway clean up (all safety and other equipment supplied), trail maintenance, campus yard maintenance/clean up, cook outs, pizza parties, ice cream socials, interact with youth in sports games, entertainment programs.

Sapelo Island National Estuarine Research Reserve Visitors Center

Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays 7:30 – 5:00
Groups of 15 or less
Trash pick up along causeway; 1 ½ mile nature trail maintenance, grounds clean up;
clean visitors center displays
Ferry trip to Sapelo Island for tour may be able to be arranged on certain days upon completion of volunteer project

Fort Frederica National Monument, National Park Service

Limb clean up; grounds maintenance; prep and paint handrails, street signs, carriages throughout the park; assemble picnic tables. (tools, equipment provided)
Audio tour of Fort Frederica available to group at no cost at end of mission task
Group size less than 20 most efficient.
weekend opportunities may be available in addition to normal business hours

Safe Harbor Children's Center & The Advocacy Center

A safe residential shelter for children and youth at risk (mostly middle to high school ages)
Weekend and evening opportunities available in addition to normal business hours
Arts/crafts; present programs; basketball or softball games in park; meet youth at bowling alley, rec center, pier village, etc. for off site activities; bake cookies with and for youth; yard work, cleaning, painting, landscaping at both locations

C. I. A. Sports Club

Christ centered children's sports ministry intentional in building relationships as Jesus did. Build relationships with the children during a 4 day camp (Mondays through Thursdays 8:00-1:00). Help teach campers about Jesus, character, excellence and teamwork.

Various sports activities offered along with small group devotion times.

Day camp dates usually May to August

Volunteers are to be 15 years of age or older.

School year program: 2:00-6:00 Monday through Thursday. Help with homework; physical activity; devotions.

Basketball program in evenings 5:30-8:00.

Operation Bed Spread

A project to improve the quality of life for local families by providing beds through the love of Jesus Christ. Begun by a Men's Bible Study group at a local United Methodist Church. Donations of beds and bedding materials are received and distributed to those in need. Needs are assessed through school social workers and others. Bible Study members deliver the beds – along with a child's book and a prayer for and with the family.

Volunteer duties: sort and make packages of bedding items (already cleaned); assist in warehouse – moving beds, keeping inventory in order.

The Farm at Oatland North

Rescue sanctuary for abused, neglected or abandoned animals.

Clean up grounds; fence repair. The Farm will supply needed equipment as necessary.

Volunteers bring gloves. All work outdoors. Many animals throughout the grounds.

Maximum group size – 20

Heather House of Glynn

Residential treatment program for women 18 years and older.

Weekends may be available
